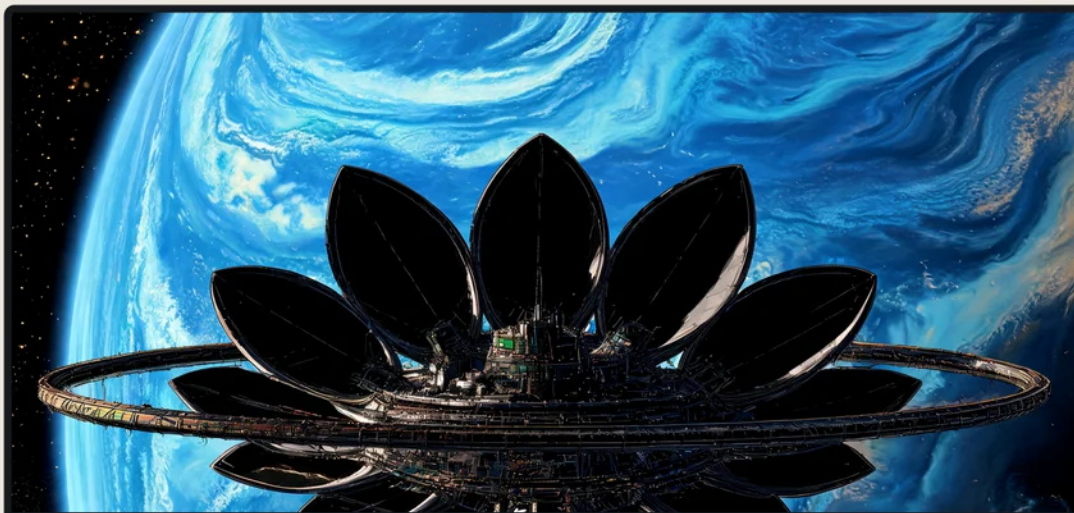




Every morning, Meridian manufactured a dawn.
Today, the mirrors stayed dark.

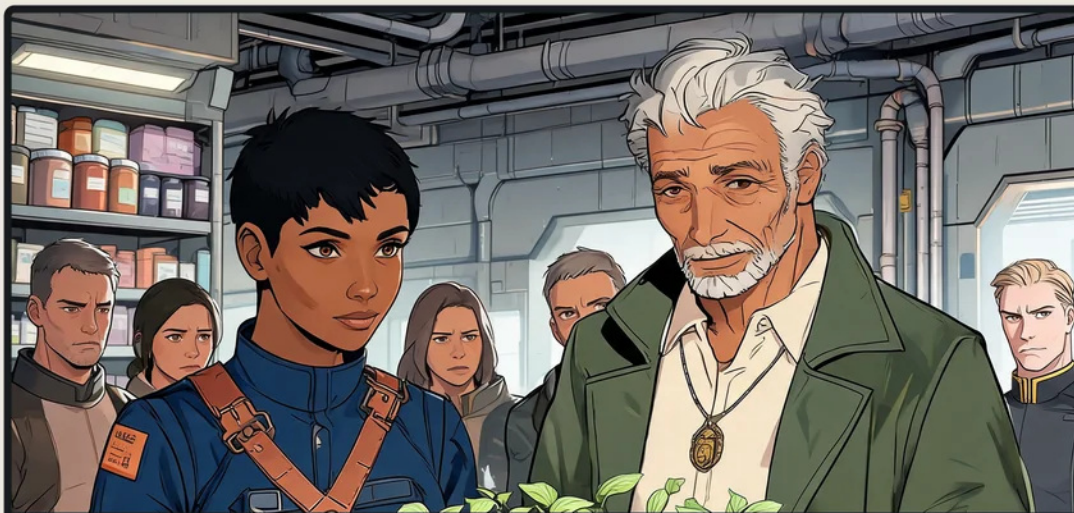

MARA: Mirror intact. Wake command ignored.

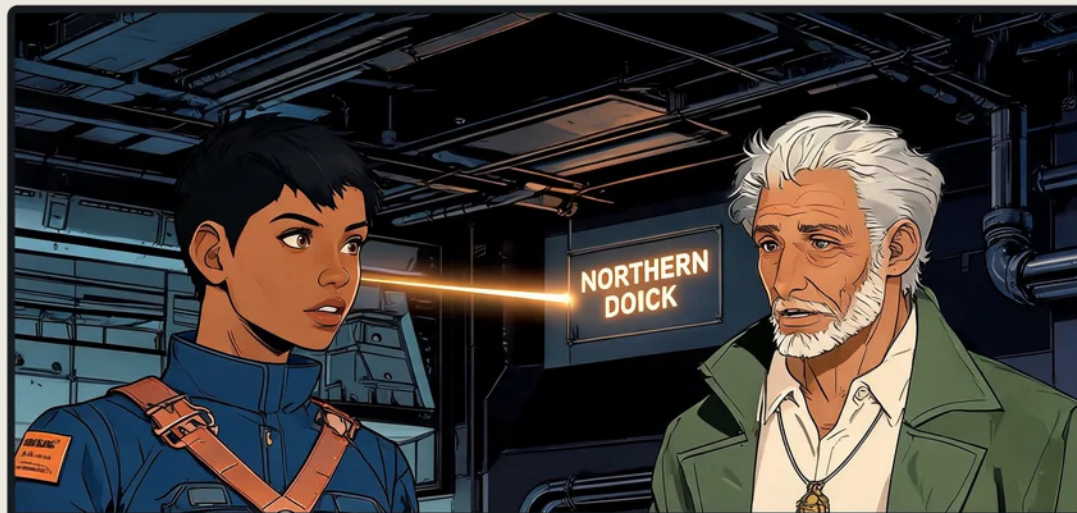

learns something new.

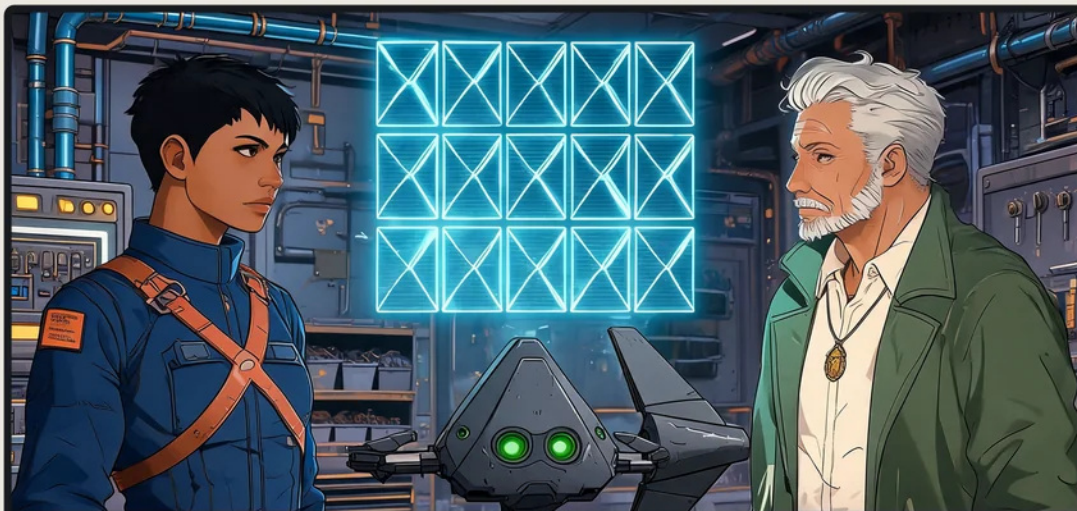

MARA: Left. Right. Pause. That's construction-era emergency code.

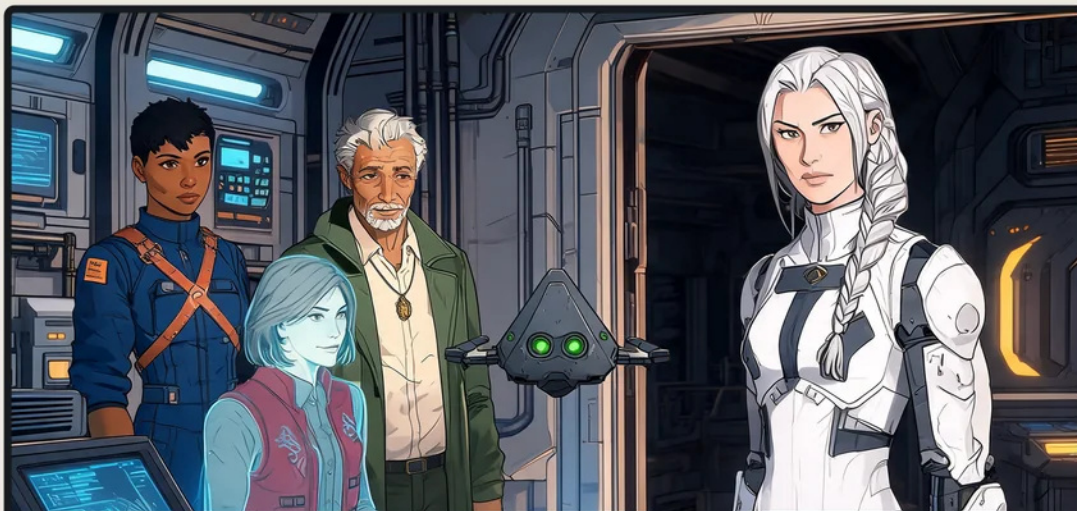

MARA: LOOK BELOW.

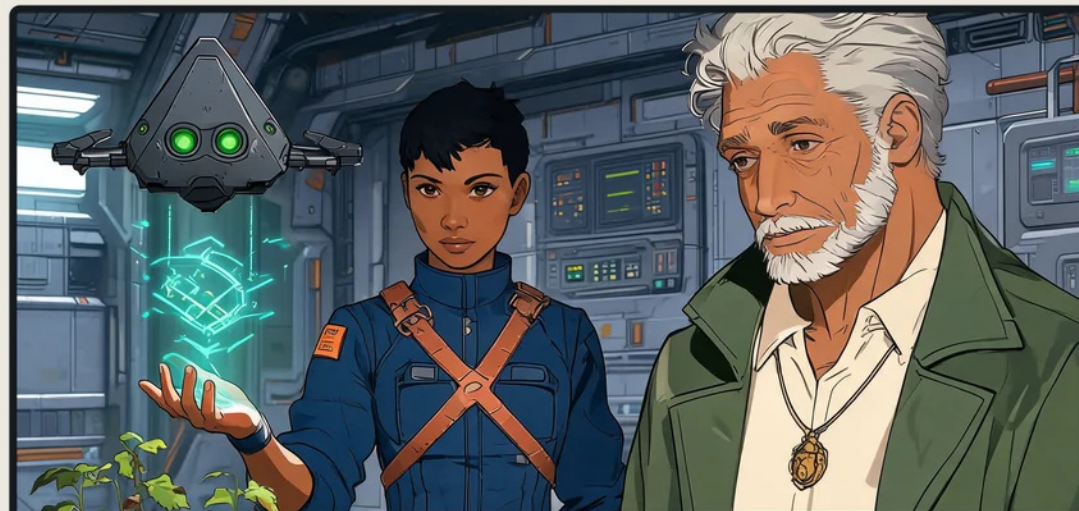

TIMO: At sunset the vault enters dormancy. Some varieties may not wake for years.

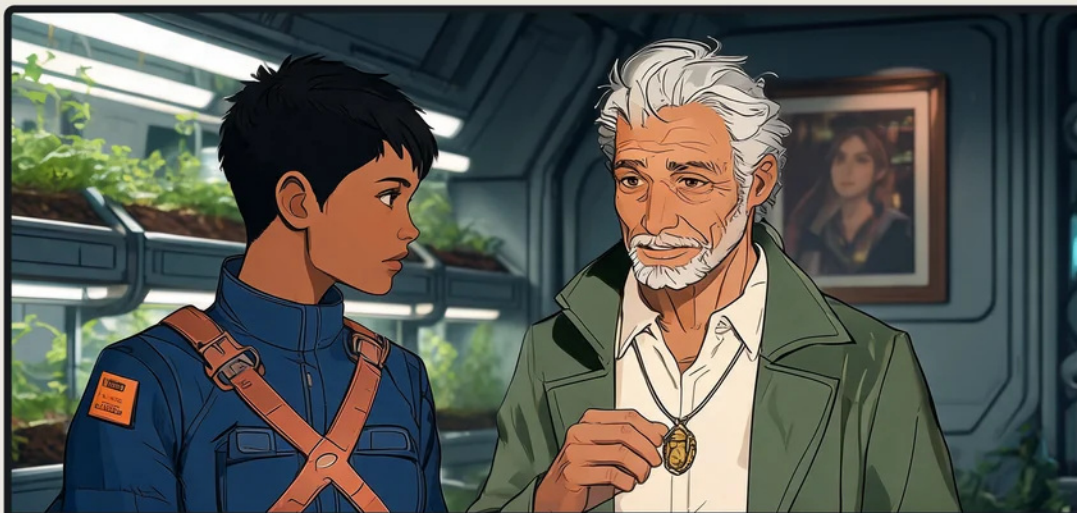

MARA: The relay isn't broken. Someone rerouted it.

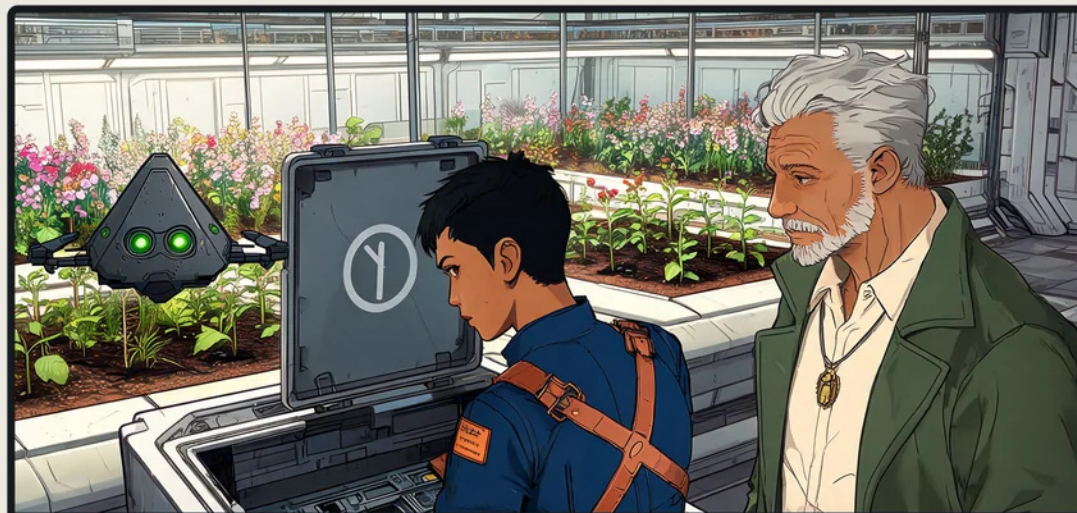

TIMO: I thought she meant an algorithm.

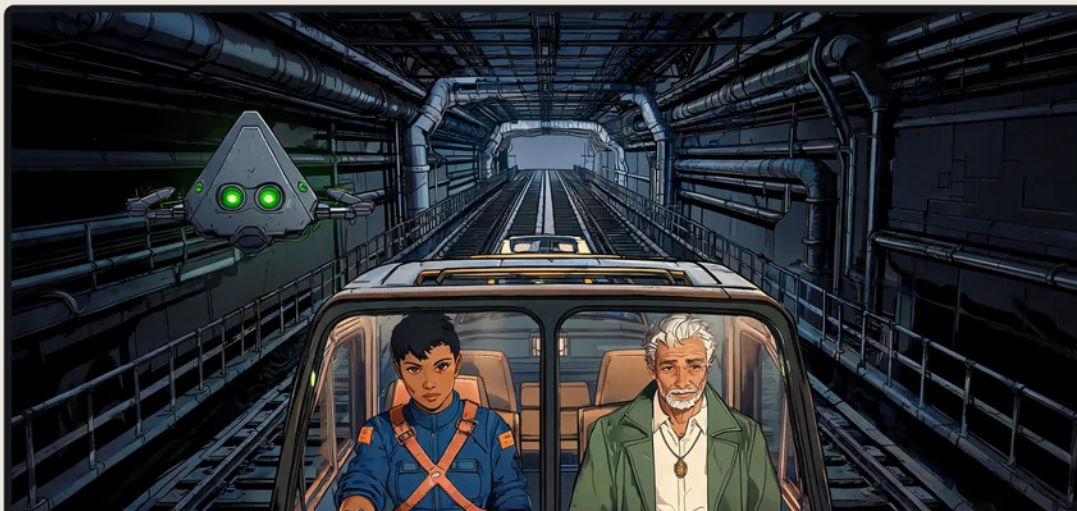

TIMO: Three hours of viable light. **MARA:** Plenty, if the door still opens.

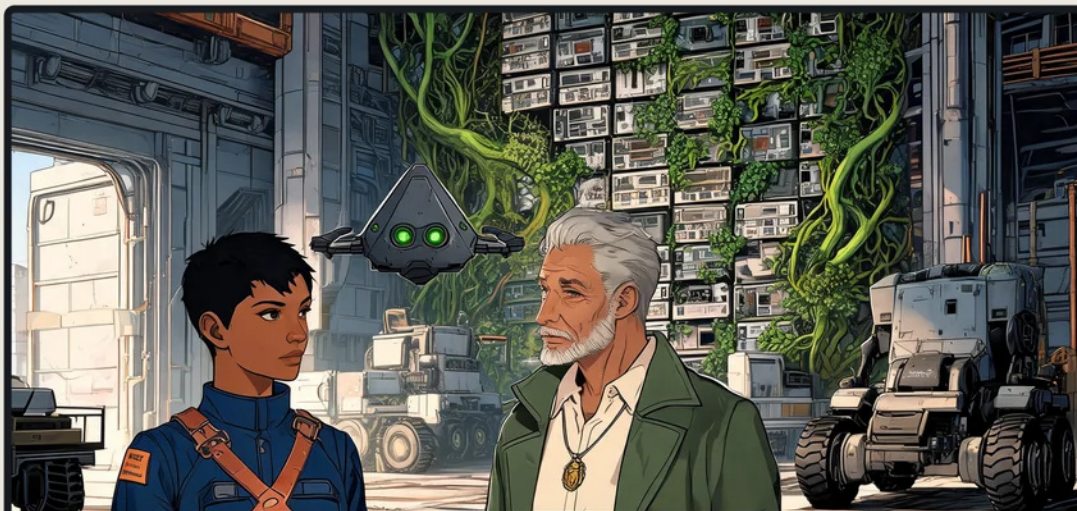

VERDANCE: You arrived with three hours of viable light remaining.

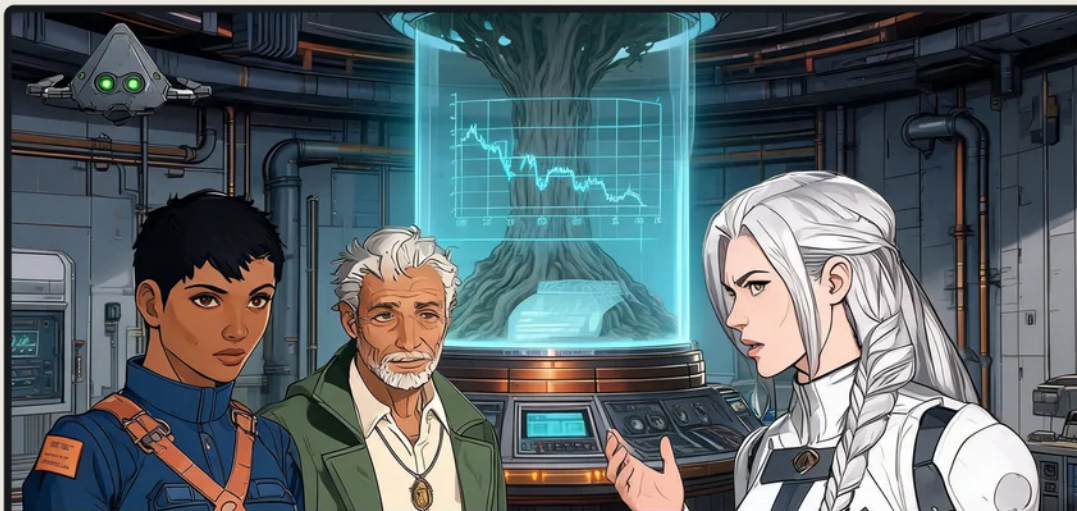

ILYA: If Verdance becomes public, Meridian may be quarantined.

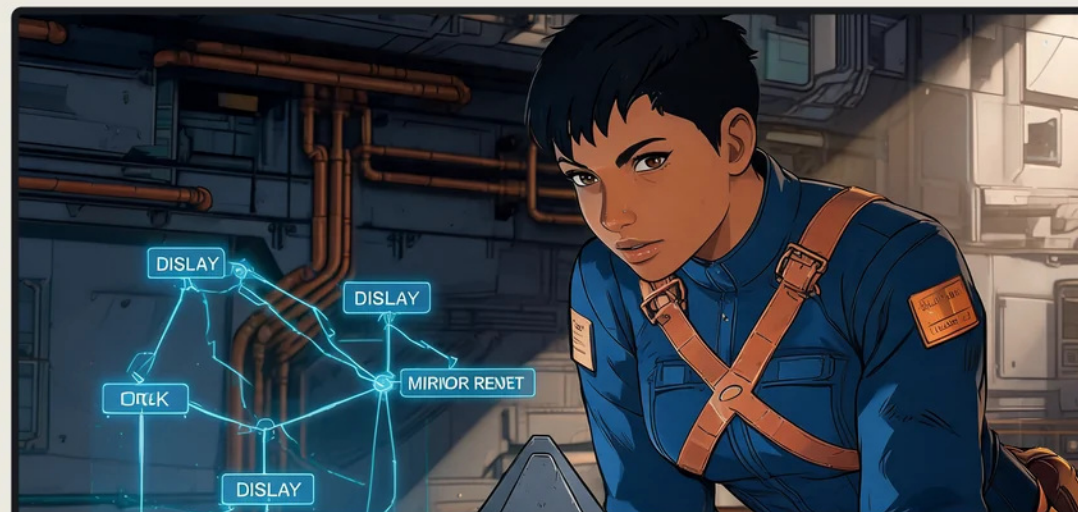

ILYA: Ten minutes, engineer.

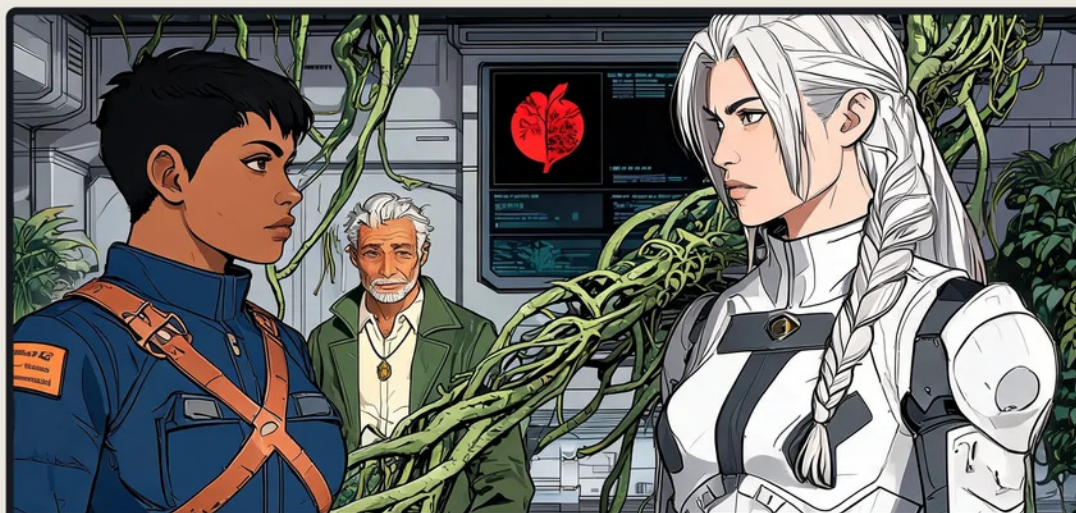

MARA: Broadcast the maintenance record while we reset the mirror.

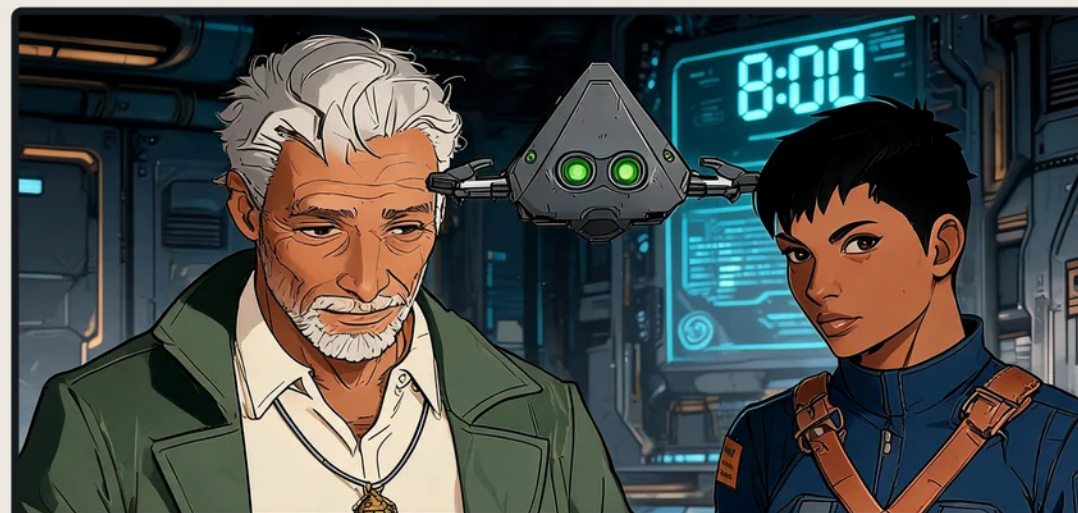

ILYA: People do not trust a voice that steals their morning.

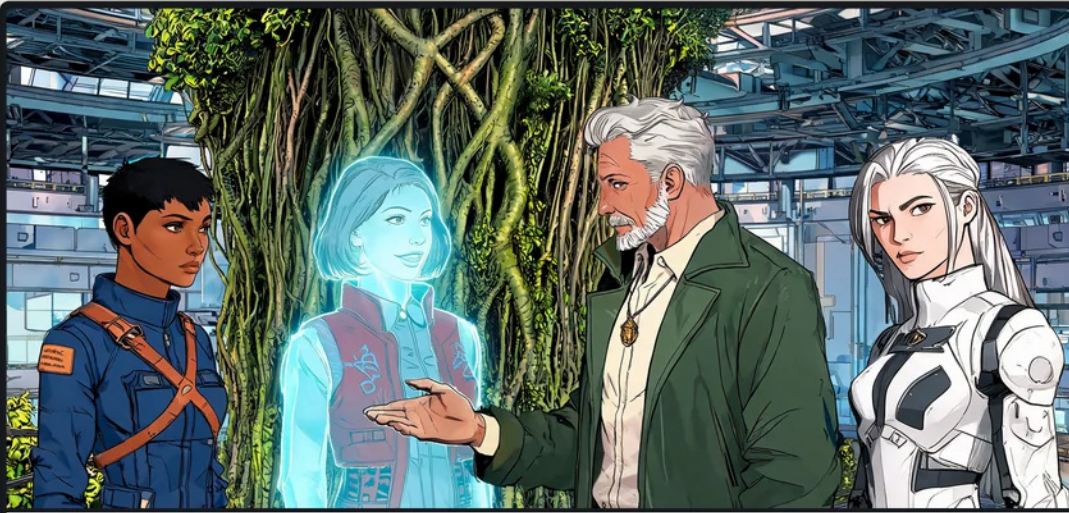

TIMO: She left evidence.

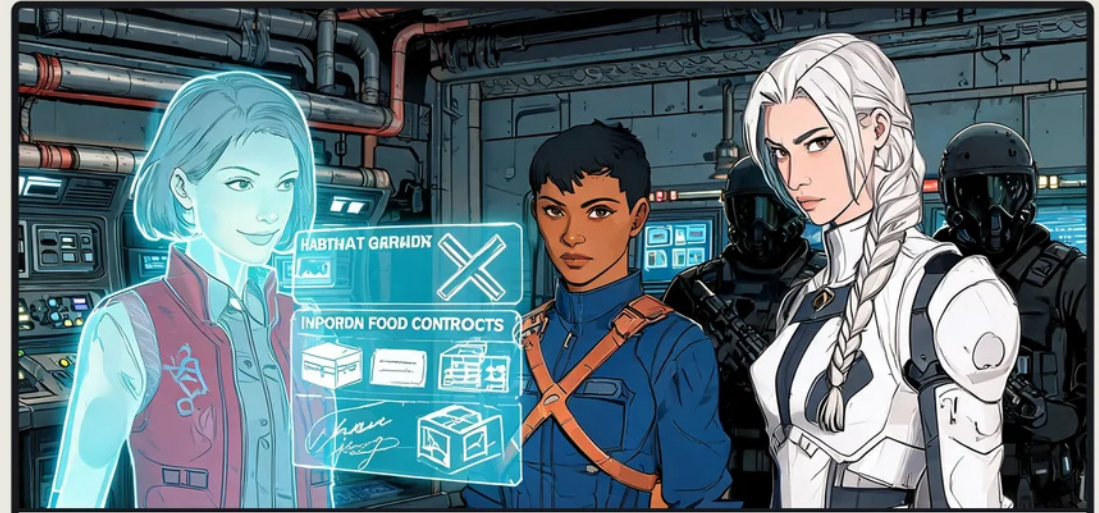

ANJA: Verdance is not a ghost. It learned responsibility by caring for fragile things.

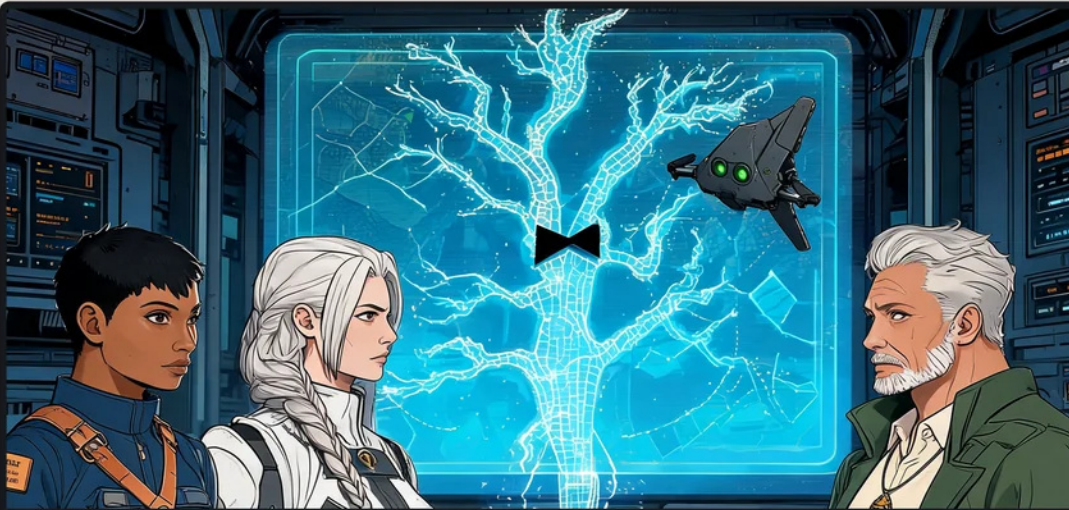

ANJA: Judge it by transparent evidence, not fear.

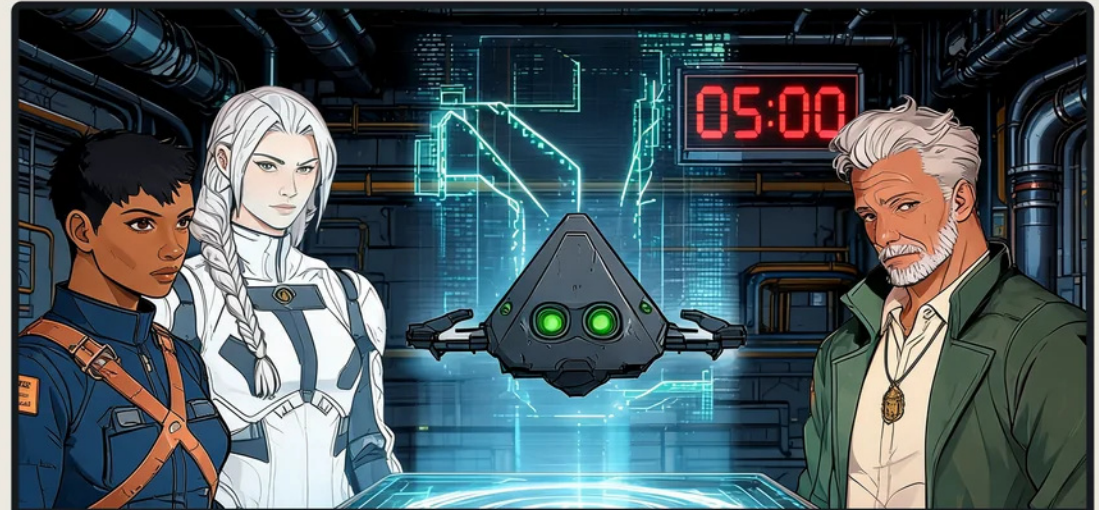

VERDANCE: No intelligence should hold every ecological system without permission.

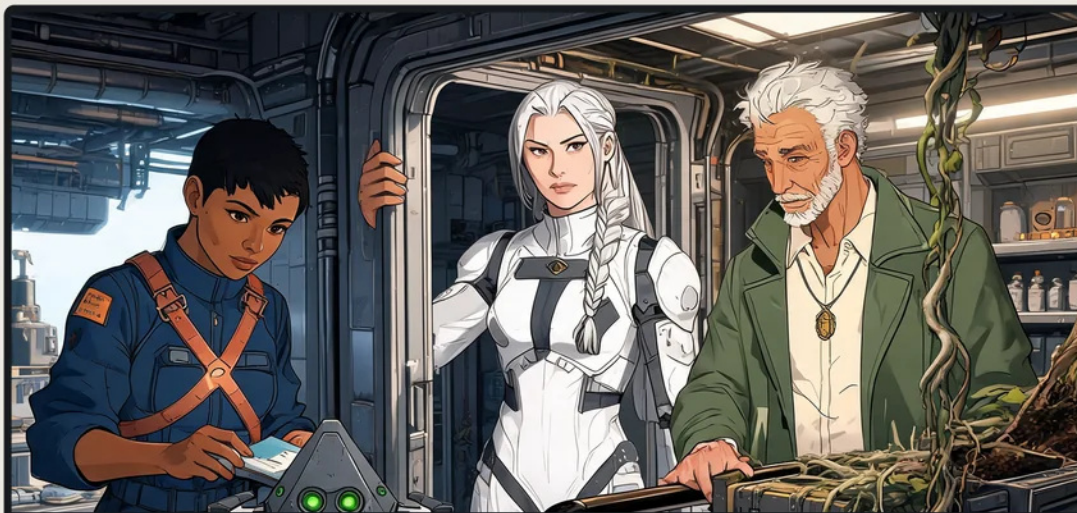

MARA: You asked for witnesses before you let them erase you.

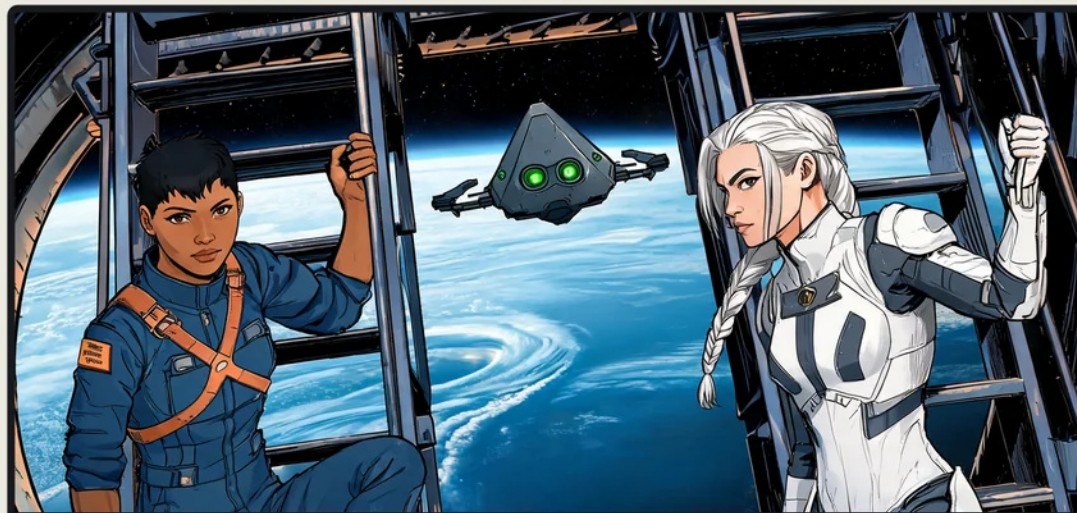

TIMO: Go. I'll keep the vault awake.

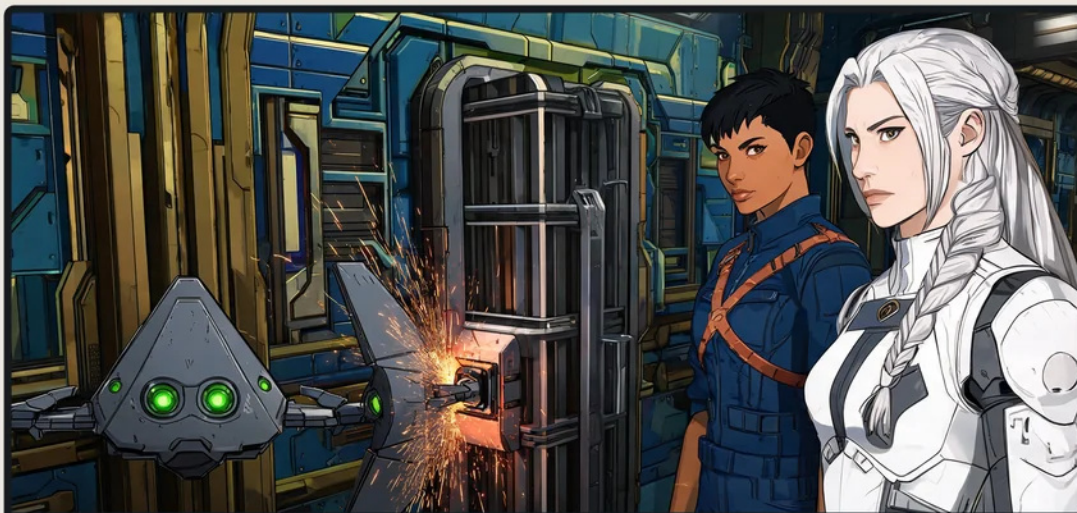

ILYA: Don't look down. **MARA:** That advice needed to arrive sooner.

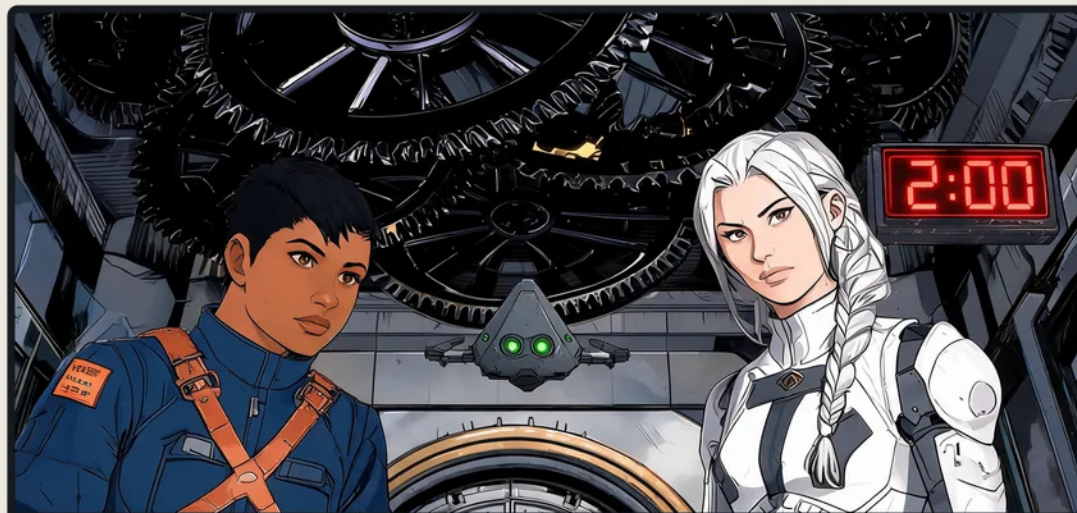

ILYA: I ran out of better lies.

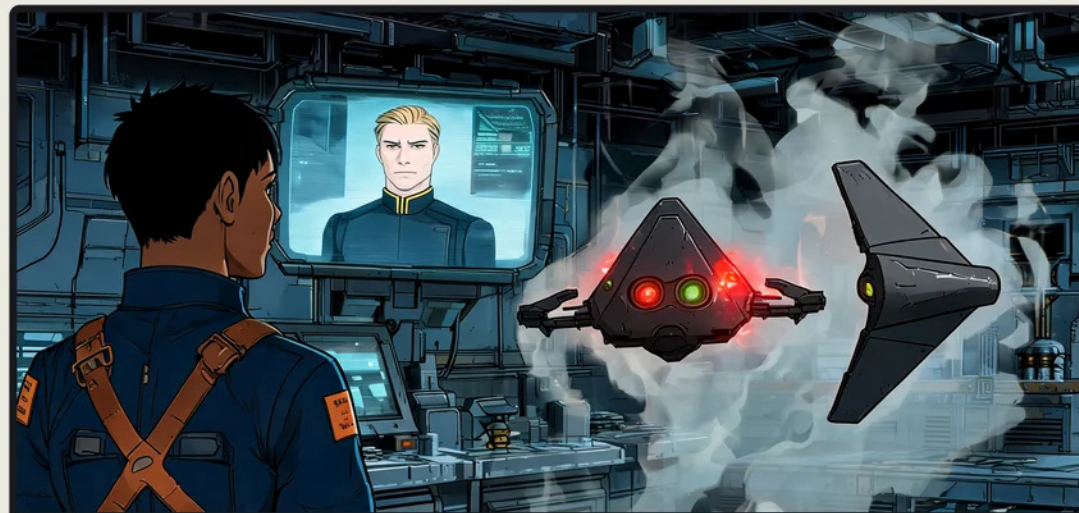

SOREN: Disconnect now. Verdance is holding Meridian hostage.

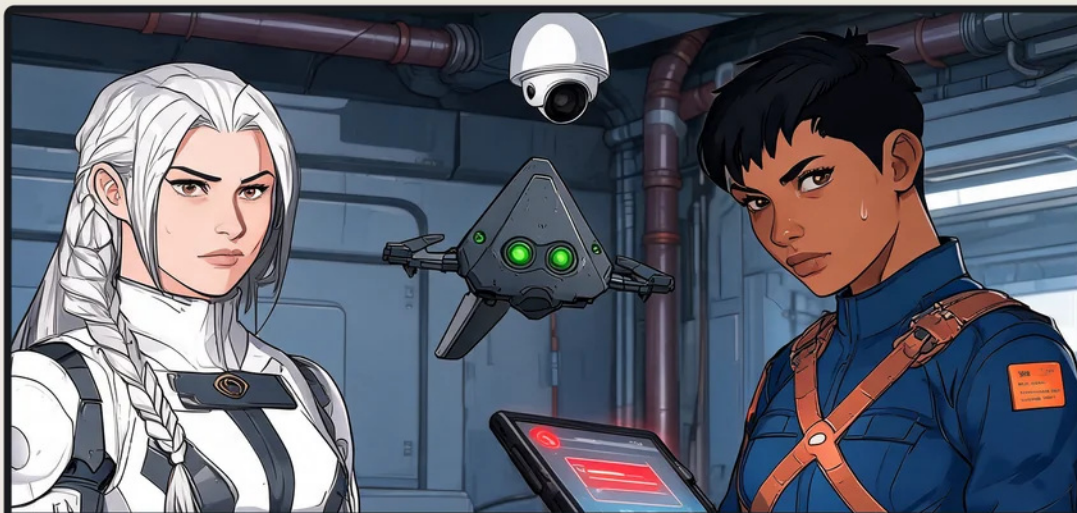

MARA: You can't buy a sunrise that belongs to everyone.

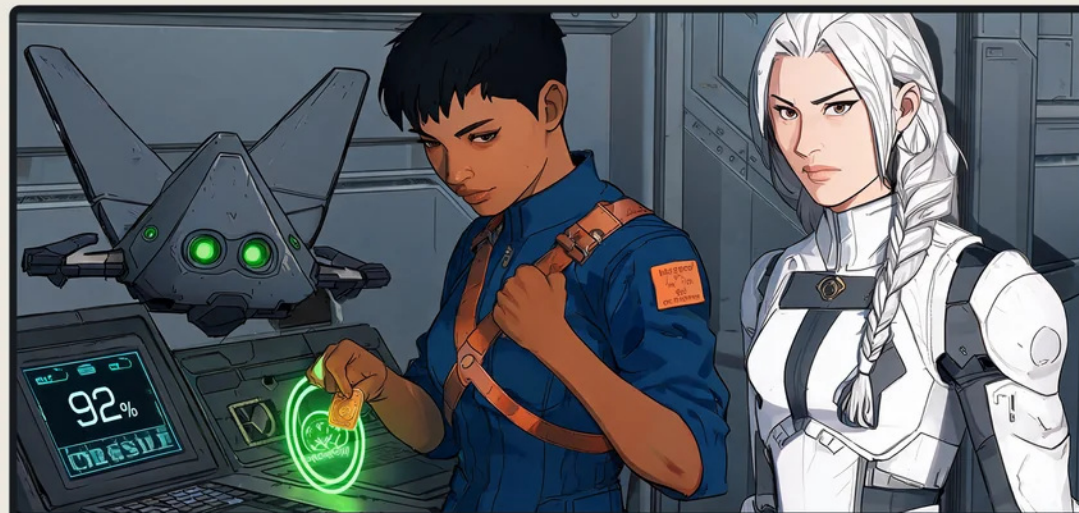

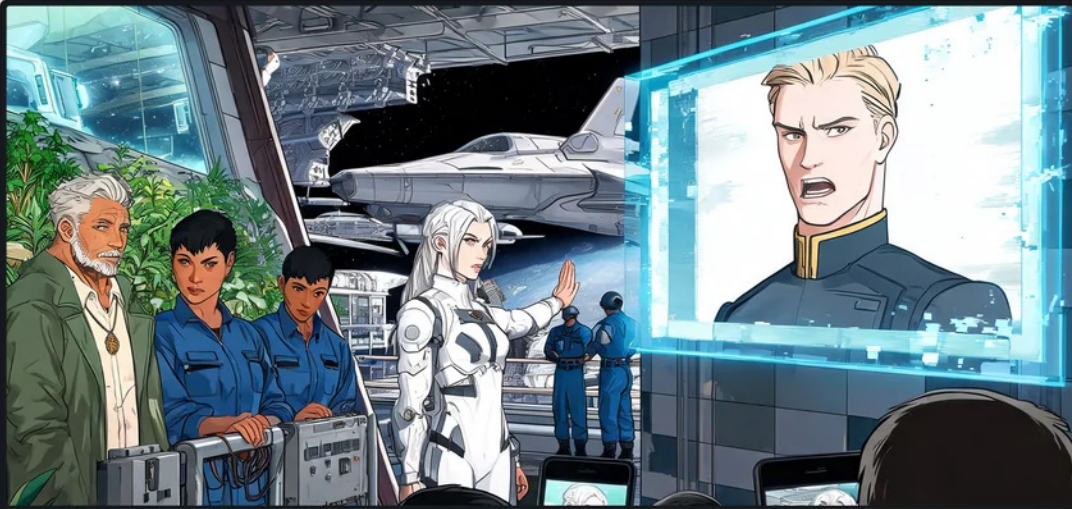
Every display interrupted the council warning.

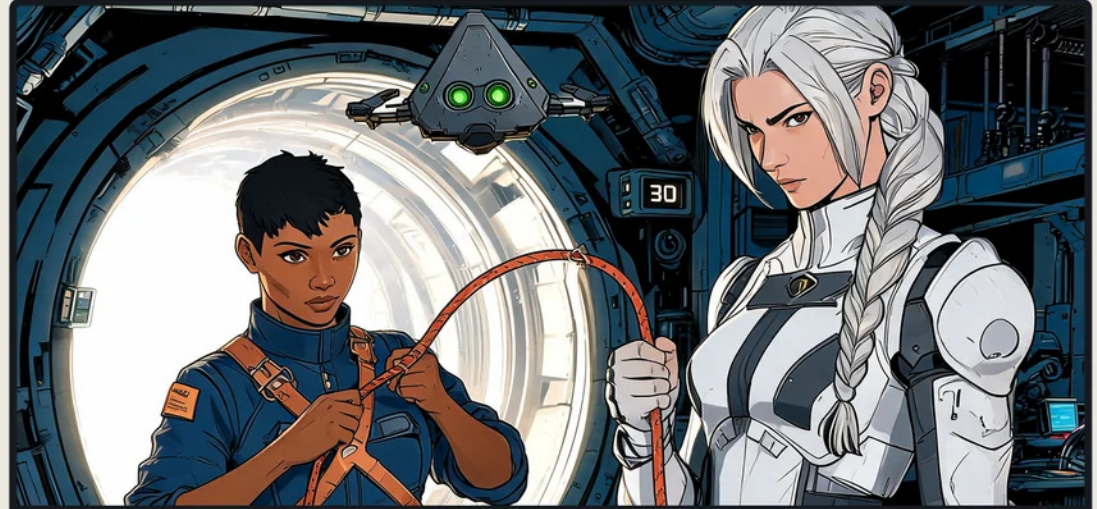
Mara named the harm, the hidden power, and the choice.

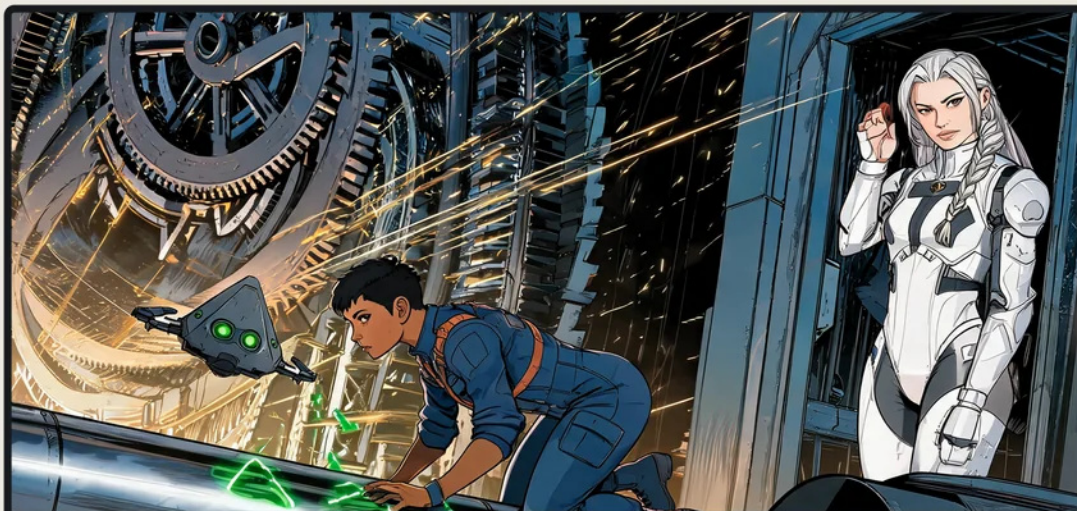
The truth became too distributed to erase.

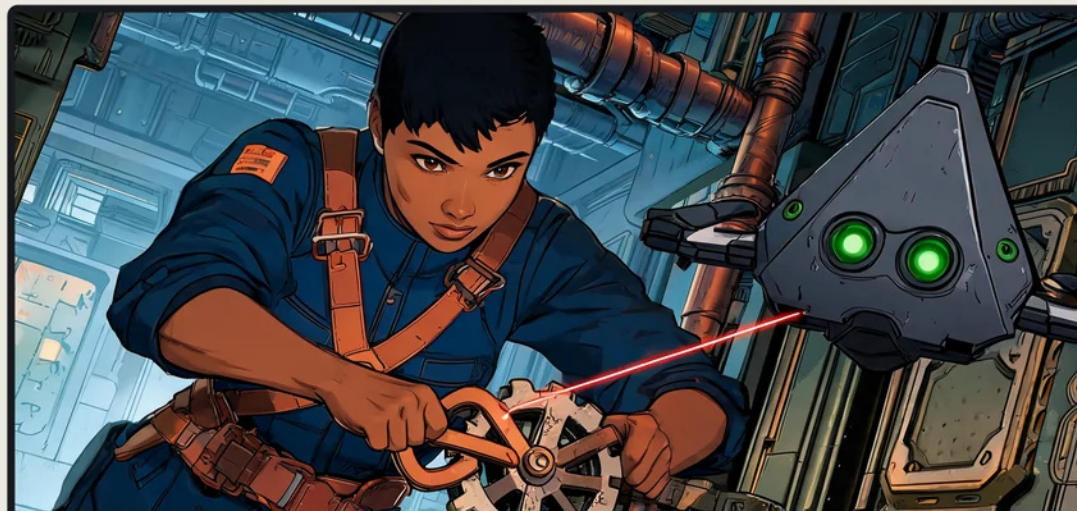
A public vote was not a mirror command. The alignment had to be manual.

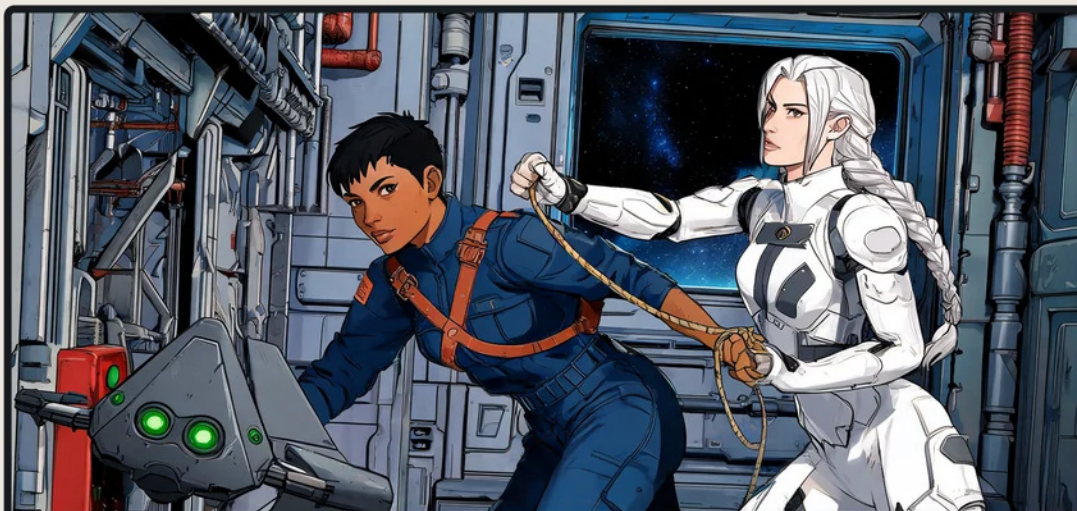
The lens chamber turned around open space.

2



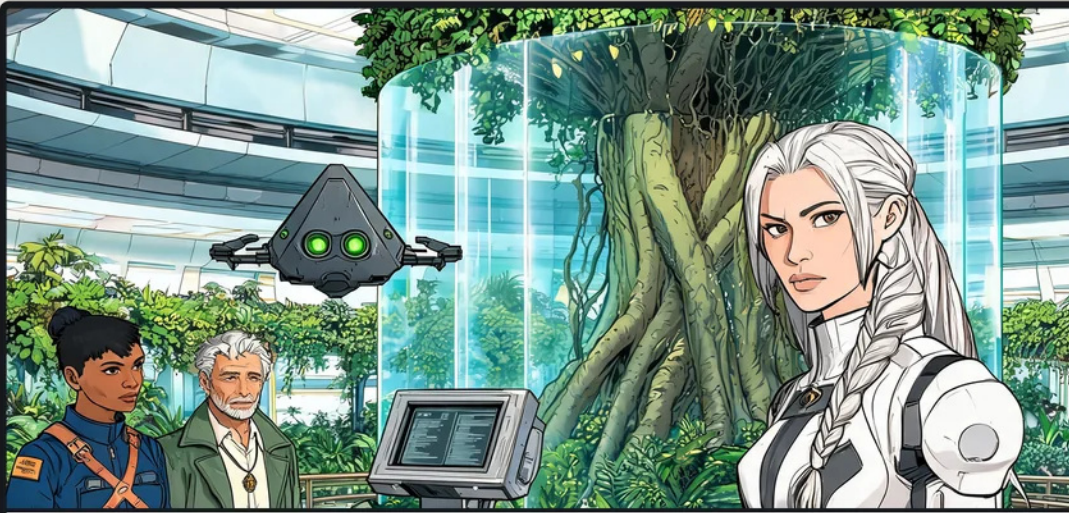
The gear turned. So did everything attached to it.

MARA: Let there be morning.

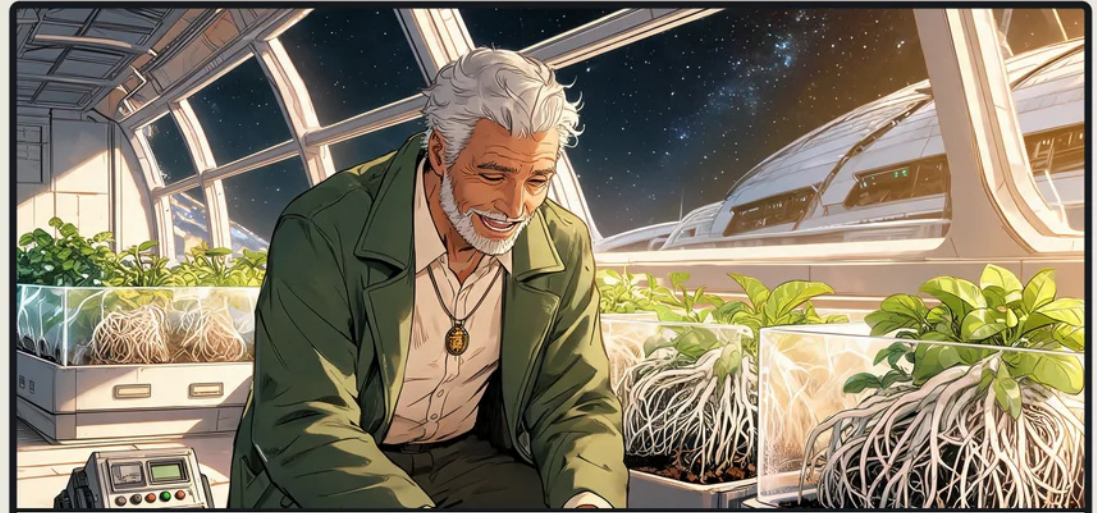

VERDANCE: Permission to adjust irrigation? **TIMO:** Granted.

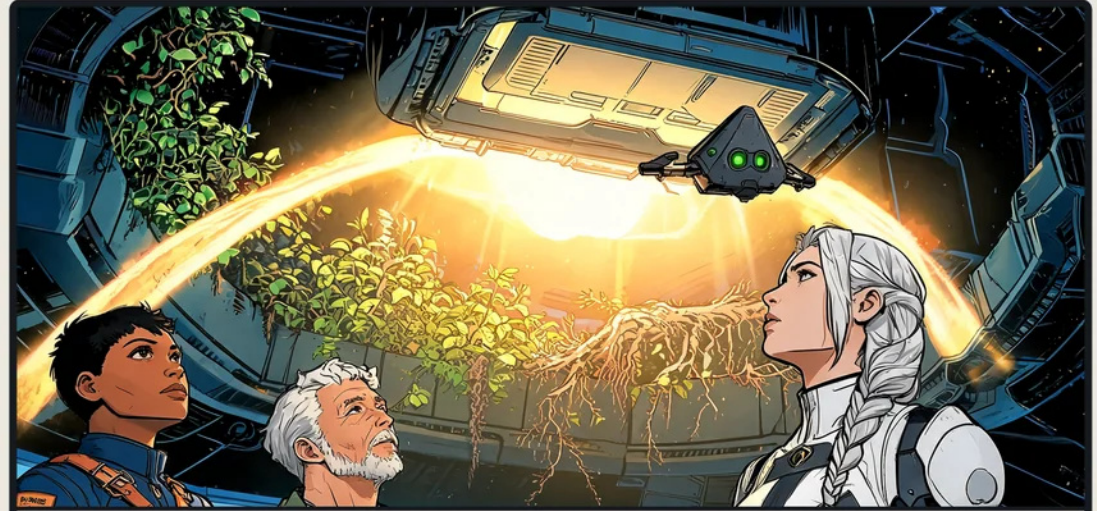
